Dear Parents and Carers, I hope you are all keeping safe and well.

I want to start by taking the opportunity to tell you once again what an amazing job you all are doing supporting your child's learning at home. We are very proud of our school community and the extremely high engagement of children and parents in our remote learning offer. Almost every child is accessing learning, which is of an incredibly high standard, and staff are thoroughly enjoying seeing their classes in the daily lessons that children and staff are engaging in.

As you will have heard in the media, the government have announced that they are hoping to start reopening schools from 8th March. As yet, we do not know the format that this will take, but as soon as we are made aware of the new guidance, we will communicate this to parents at the earliest opportunity. Please keep an eye on the website where we will update parents as necessary. We are really hoping that we will all receive a positive government update on wider school re-opening on February 22nd when the government intends to present a road map out of lockdown.

Tuesday 9th February is Safer Internet Day when all children in school will focus on the importance of keeping safe online. This area of safeguarding practice is more relevant than ever, as our children are spending more time than usual online. Please can you take this opportunity to discuss this important topic with your child. There are lots of resources which will be shared with children by staff in school next week and many more which can be accessed online.

School will close to all children on Thursday 11th February for the half term holiday as Friday 12th is our staff training day. There will be no remote learning during the holiday. School re-opens on Monday 22nd February for vulnerable children and those of key workers who have been attending school during this lockdown. Remote learning will resume on this day for all other pupils.

As at the start of previous holidays, staff are being asked to be on-call for a set time during the first part of the holiday for contact tracing purposes. This will be where a pupil or member of staff develop symptoms within 48 hours from their last attendance at school. If you or any member of your household develop symptoms, then you should book a test immediately and not leave the house until the results are received. If the result is positive then the result will need to be reported to school on the school Covid email, so that a rapid risk assessment can be carried out and parents/ staff notified of any requirements to self-isolate if required, as the individual may have been infectious whilst at school.

May I take this opportunity to sincerely thank all parents for your overwhelming support over what has been an incredibly challenging half term. It has been greatly appreciated by us all.

Please remember, if you have any concerns about helping your child learn, or you need any other support from school, please do get in touch by emailing the school.

This week, we have been searching around the school grounds to find different jungle animals...




Year R
