

## A message from our Headteacher: Jill O'Connor

Dear Parents and Carers.

I hope everyone is keeping well. We have had several positive Covid cases over last weekend and in the early part of this week. I am pleased to report that these incidents have now slowed right down, and we are pleased to welcome isolating children and staff back as their isolation period ends. Most of our cases have been in Key Stage 1. All positive cases are reported to the LA and PHE who monitor the situation continually. They are very happy with our risk assessment and mitigations that we have in place to keep everyone safe. Thank you for continuing to support us with following government and school Covid protocols and for reporting any positive cases of children with symptoms or positive test results. All children isolating can join live teaching from their classroom through Teams so that any disruption to their learning is kept to a minimum.

We have had another exciting week in school with visits from a Roman soldier for Year 4 and a Portals to the Past Workshop which was enjoyed by Year 5. Check out the Twitter feeds to capture these events. Year 6 will be making a visit to Coventry Cathedral next week to launch their new topic.

We are in the process of confirming bookings with Coventry Music to begin an exciting music offer for children to start this term. Year 4 will shortly be starting a whole class teaching music lesson, where they will have the opportunity to learn a musical instrument. Extra- curricular and individual music lessons will be offered, along with a Manor Park University choir course after half term Further details to follow.

## Are you entitled to Free School Meals?

Entitlement to free school meals is processed as part of housing benefit/council tax support claims by the Benefits Service. Free School Meals are a statutory benefit. Applying for a free school meal could raise up to an extra £1320 per annum for six years for your child's school (funded by central government). This can help to fund valuable teaching and learning support for school (and is still paid to the school even if your entitlement ceases).

All children in Reception to Year 2 automatically receive a free school meal. However, if your family also meets the eligibility criteria to enable a free school meal to be awarded (<u>see attached</u>), it is important to make an application in order that your child's school can receive this pupil premium. It takes less than two minutes to apply and submit your application on the Coventry City Council website. To do so, please <u>click here</u>, Please contact us if you require any help in doing this.

## EYFS Phase: Nursery & Reception

What a wonderful week we have had in Early Years. The children in Wrens and Robins have been exploring, experimenting and sharing, with the children in Kingfishers working hard on turn taking and creative play. We use Read Write Inc. as our phonics scheme and there are lots of links and YouTube clips available for you to help support your child at home. This supports our English curriculum and links to writing. We have been challenging the children to write their names and also to hear, say and write the initial sounds in words. #### Learning in Year 1





## Extra Bank Holiday

## Extra bank holiday announced for Queen's 2022 platinum jubilee

The nation is set to be treated with an extra day off to mark the Queen reaching 70 years on the throne.

As part of what is being billed as a "blockbuster" celebration for Her Majesty's platinum jubilee in 2022, people will enjoy a UK-wide four-day weekend in recognition of the first time that a British monarch reaches the milestone.

The May bank holiday weekend is being shifted to the start of June and an additional day is being added to the bank holiday calendar, allowing four days of events that the government promises will "mix the best of British ceremonial splendour and pageantry with cutting edge artistic and technological displays".

Celebrations will recognise the 94-year-old monarch's impact over the course of her historic reign, which has featured 14 prime ministers since she took the throne aged only 25 in 1952.

As the additional bank holiday falls within school's half term holiday, all schools are requested to close to children and staff at on some other day in lieu of this additional bank holiday.

Manor Park will be adding this missed day onto the half term break and will be closing on Monday 6th June 2022.

We will be covering this historic event with children in school in the run up to this important event.

We have made changes to our term time calendar for 2022 to reflect these changes.
