A message from our Headteacher: Jill O'Connor

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you are all keeping safe and well. We have had another very busy week in school. The children continue to be exceptional and are fully immersed in their learning. We are so impressed with the standard of their work and enthusiasm in all areas of school life. I am sure that you will thoroughly enjoy meeting your child's teacher next week to share their wonderful achievements. If you haven't made an appointment for parents evening and would like to do so, please do this online in the usual way. The staff are looking forward to meeting you, albeit virtually, to continue the strong school parent partnership which we all really value and enjoy.

As part of the ongoing problems that we encounter with parking on the road outside school, our PTA have kindly funded parking buddies which are large personalised traffic signs to mark out safe zones for children and families to enter school. These will be in place daily from next Monday outside the upper phase entrance between the hours of 7.30 am and 4pm. The designated area must strictly remain a traffic free zone, as it needs to remain a safe place for children and parents. Eventually we are hoping that the council will continue the yellow zig zags in this area in line with other pedestrian areas outside school. Whilst we appreciate that the road outside school is badly congested at dropping off and collection times, I am certain that everyone will agree that the safety of everyone in our school community has got to be the main concern and responsibility of everyone. I am confident that you will all get behind this scheme and find a safe place to park a little further from school when bringing and collecting children to school in vehicles. Of course, an alternative safer and healthier route to school, is on foot or cycling. We have ample bike sheds if your child would like to cycle to school. Thank you for your co-operation in this very important matter. Our thanks are extended to the PTA for funding this project to help to keep our wonderful children safe.

Sunday 17th October is UN International Day for the Eradication of Poverty. Children will be learning more about this in assembly on Monday and we are hoping to create links with charities tackling this worldwide problem over the academic year.

We will be launching a new school house point system after half term. Children will be placed in one of our four houses which are all linked to our city. The houses are Artists, Engineers, Athletes and Change -Makers. When your child comes home and tells you the house they are in, their first job is to research the links their house has to the history of the city of Coventry. This research is a good half term project for them to immerse themselves in, with house points to be earned! House points will be awarded to children who display behaviour or accomplishments linked to our personal qualities which are self- sufficient, original, attitude and resilience (SOAR). Coloured tokens will be collected in houses for each quality in large tubes in the entrance hall, which will culminate in a half- termly prize for the winning house and personal quality.

On Tuesday afternoon Coventry Music, our new music provider, is coming into school to present a wide range of instruments to upper phase. Following the demonstration, the children will bring home information about signing up to begin tuition in an instrument of their choice if they would like to do so. We are really looking forward to renewing our work with Coventry Music as they will be also be starting a school choir as part of Manor Park University courses on Friday afternoons.
