Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you all had an enjoyable half term holiday spent with families and friends. We are all delighted to be back in school for another very exciting half term. I am pleased to inform you that positive covid cases in school have dropped significantly following the holiday. It is important that we all continue to work together and follow public health advice during the winter months so that we ensure cases remain low in our community.

I am pleased to inform you that over the holiday we had the path by the upper phase gate installed, along with a tarmac waiting area for parents. This has significantly improved this entrance for our upper phase children. Can I thank you for all getting behind our new admission arrangements and parking buddies' scheme which are a great success and are creating a much safer experience for our community at the busy times of the school day.

As the clocks have now been set back an hour and the nights are drawing in, we are reminding children about keeping safe in the dark and, in particular, road safety. Sadly, road crashes are a major cause of death and injury among the young so teaching road safety is crucial. Visibility is key to keeping our children safe. 
#### Learning in Year 6
