Dear Parents and Carers,

What a wonderful week we have had!

We have all thoroughly enjoyed reuniting physically as a school community. The children have once again been amazing, and they have brought the school back to life with their chatter, enthusiasm and laughter. It has been such a pleasure to see their excitement and the smiles on their faces as they have been able to reunite with their friends and the staff.

The children should be immensely proud of themselves and the way in which they have coped over the last few weeks. They are so resilient and adaptable. They are confidently taking each new day in their stride, trying their hardest with new learning and are being a good friend to those around them. We feel so privileged to have been able to share in this excitement with the children and catch up with all their news. Attendance has been really high at over 98% and we have been delighted to welcome so many new nursery children to school. A very

welcome to all our new children and families. I am certain that you will be very happy with us but please ask for help if you need anything at all.

A reminder that our learning mentor team is here for you if anybody feels that they need any help. The team can support you with any early help, including practical and emotional support and signposting parents to services that could help them. It is very much business as usual in school. We are continuing with our full curriculum offer, carefully supporting any children who need it and the children are thriving. All staff are deployed carefully to ensure the correct expertise is in the right place, with SLT supporting classroom teaching daily. Staff have worked hard with children this week to assess learning, and we have been amazed at the progress children have made and the many new skills they have acquired. You have done a wonderful job in supporting them alongside the live teaching we were able to offer during the school closure. I would like to reassure parents that there is no catch element to our teaching, rather we are doing what we always do, which is to nurture and teach every child at their own level, with a drive for excellence and the highest academic standards permeating school life. We are not concerned about children possibly needing to go back over anything they have found tricky or supporting them individually if they need that help. Please continue to do what you always do, which is to support your children and reassure them, letting staff know any concerns you may have. Above all, do not worry that your child may have fallen behind or struggled during the school closure. We have no concerns in this area and we are confident that children will meet their full potential and age-related expectations each day that they are in school.

Can I once again thank you for the unconditional support you have given to your children, the staff, leadership team and school throughout the last twelve months. This has been, and continues to be, greatly appreciated and certainly makes our work more effective for the benefit of every child. What a journey it has been since we were first instructed to close on March 20th last year, whilst scrambling to buy toilet rolls and soap! I sincerely believe that we have been on a learning journey together, and whilst this may have been the greatest challenge we have faced, we have all acquired new skills and more resources so that we are better prepared for future challenges. That is how we grow and become stronger.
