## A message from our Headteacher: Jill O'Connor

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you are all keeping safe and well. Life in school continues to go extremely well. There is a vibrant, positive buzz everywhere, as children continue to enjoy learning and socialising with their friends.

Thank you for all your support for our Red Nose Day activities today. We will let you know the final amount we have raised when it has all been collected, with all donations going directly to this amazing charity.

I am delighted to inform you that following two days of interviews, we have appointed a new deputy headteacher to join us in September. Mrs Rebekah Hodt is currently working as vice principal in a very large school in the UAE. She is bringing a wide range of senior leadership expertise with her and will hopefully be back in the UK in early July when we can all meet her. Mrs Sanders is reducing her working week to three days after the Easter holiday, when she will be in school on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday each week. This working pattern will support her as her family are due to move to Cumbria any time soon.

I am delighted to inform you that Mrs Scott is expecting her first baby which is due in late summer. Our best wishes are extended to Lianne and her husband at this exciting time.

If you have not already done so, please register for the Coventry Holiday Activities and Food Programme which can be accessed by all children who are eligible for free school meals. This exciting programme will provide children with access to a range of activities, online resources and food. This is in addition to the FSM vouchers which all eligible children will receive for the 11-day Easter holiday period. Details of the programme can be found on **the website link here**.

We are continuing to rapidly roll out our 1 :1 and small group support for children across school through the National Tutoring Programme. The first sessions have successfully taken place this week. We are actively recruiting more teachers to work with us on this programme, with some sessions taking place in school as part of the school day, alongside other after-school remote sessions. All these sessions will be in addition to maths and English lessons which every child will be taught daily by their own class teacher. Staff will contact parents directly if they feel their child would benefit from this work. I would strongly urge you to take the offer up if you possibly can, as it is very much aimed at supporting children's confidence and well-being in areas where they may feel they would benefit from some recap or reinforcement with their learning.

A reminder that school will be closing on Wednesday March 31st as Thursday 1st April is our training day.


#### Learning in EYEP

#### Learning in Year 3
