## A message from our Headteacher: Jill O'Connor

Dear Parents and Carers,

Staff are looking forward to meeting parents remotely next week for parents' evenings on Tuesday and Wednesday, with appointments taking place between 4pm and 6.30pm. If you have not already booked an appointment, please do so through the online booking system.

We are all excited about the next stage of the roadmap out of lockdown which starts on Monday, when many new social activities can resume. Unfortunately, there will be no new changes that we can implement in school. The updated government guidance that we have been issued with this month in preparation for May 17th has changed nothing in relation to how primary schools will operate - hand-washing, additional cleaning, good cough hygiene, isolation and testing if showing symptoms, bubbling (including different break times, start and finish times, lunchtimes, assemblies wherever possible), mask wearing by staff while moving around school and mask wearing by adults at drop off and pick up times are all still in place. Thank you for your continued assistance in making these measures happen and patience as we hopefully move towards a full lifting of restrictions. We have however all fully adjusted to our 'new normal' and school life is continuing to go very well. Everybody is thriving and thoroughly enjoying the summer term.

We are very excited about the wide range of events that will be held over the year. Do look out for these events as we begin this exciting year of celebration to mark this prestigious award.

#### Learning in Year 1

The children in Year 1 have been so busy this week with lots of interactive maths, outdoor learning and creative activities. We have been exploring our senses in Science and we have loved all of the practical tasks to do with sight, smell and touch; it has been a super week.

#### Learning in Year 2

Year 2 have been learning all about different types of measurement in maths this week. We have used rulers to measure length, thermometers to measure temperature, jugs to measure volume and scales to measure mass. Fantastic measuring Year 2!

#### Learning in Year 4

As part of our Totems and Tepees Creative Curriculum, Year 4 have been researching Native American tribes. We found information on the Inuits, Cherokee, Navajo, and Iroquois tribes.

### Learning in Year 5

This week in Science, we have been using film canisters and counters to find out whether weight makes a difference to the speed of the film canister dropping. Our question is, "Does a heavy object fall at a greater speed?" We made observations, recorded and wrote conclusions explaining what we found out. We have also researched Sir Isaac Newton. We came up with questions we wanted to answer about him and specifically looked at his discoveries.

### Learning in Year 6

This week, Year 6 have been learning about ratio. They have been absolutely incredible mathematicians and thoroughly enjoyed applying their learning to a maths investigation: using ratio, the children were tasked with working out the building materials needed for a colourful, new Manor Park building. They had a fantastic time and showed amazing resilience! Well done, Year 6.

This week, we have launched in school that we will be learning about the UNICEF Global Goals.

The Global Goals are a set of 17 sustainability areas that have been agreed by world wide leaders to help create a better world by 2030.
