

A message from our Headteacher: Jill O'Connor

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you are all continuing to keep safe and well.

As we have entered the next step in the Government's roadmap out of lockdown, I want to once again remind parents about the procedures that we will continue to follow in line with the Local Authority for the management of schools, both now and over the next few weeks.

As a school, our prudent risk assessments have proved to be invaluable in keeping everyone safe. Collectively, we have all worked hard to keep transmission low, ensuring we have not had to isolate any bubbles and we have had no Covid related staff absence. I cannot stress enough the importance that we all continue to do so, so as not to jeopardise or undo everything we have all tirelessly worked to achieve.

Although there is a steady relaxing of social restrictions outside of school, it is important to note that guidance around group sizes and social distancing remains. All DfE guidance indicates that limiting group sizes and maintaining the integrity of bubbles is still essential. This impacts on plans we would usually be sharing about induction and other summer term events. I appreciate that this may be confusing and can seem contradictory to some of the wider media messages. Please be assured that as soon as we can safely begin relaxing our COVID measures, we will. We are looking forward to being able to welcome you back to school events as soon as it is safe to do so, although early indications are that the restrictions will continue to impact on summer events and at the moment we don't believe we will be able to invite any parents or new children into school for face to face events over the summer term.

In the interim, the school will continue with the procedures we have in place. We request that you as parents/carers/grandparents/members of the community understand and respect that these will continue to be in place for the foreseeable future. Thank you for your continued support in working with us as we continue to work within these Government restrictions.

It was lovely for staff to meet you, albeit remotely, for our parent consultation meetings this week. Feedback from staff and parents has once again been very positive.

The photographer will be in school on Thursday taking traditional and fun-themed class group photographs. There will be no opportunity for individual or family groups on this occasion as we offer this opportunity in the autumn term.

There will be online parent meetings on Thursday at 5.30pm led by Abi Hart for RSE and a DYM meeting on Friday at 6pm for Year 6 parents led by Tracy Brown and the staff who are attending the residential. Please do attend these meetings if you feel they would be beneficial for you.

Keisha Crosby will be completing her Early Educator apprenticeship in May and she will be leaving us at May half term. Good luck to Keisha in her new pursuits as she is planning to relocate to Japan with her family.

Finally, a lot of children are bringing Pop It fidget toys and Rubik's Cubes into school which are causing several problems. In line with our policies, can I kindly request that children do not bring these into school please. The only exception to this would be for vulnerable children who need them to support any additional provision in school they need, with permission to do so given by the inclusion team. Please contact Mrs Healy directly if you would like to discuss this provision for your child with her.

School closes on Friday 28th May at the usual time and we will return on Monday 7th June. Have a wonderful half term holiday when it arrives.

The children in Nursery have been having fun with their friends in the outdoor area. They have been playing tea parties with their favourite toys.


Learning in Reception

Learning in Year 2



Learning in Year 4

Learning in Year 5
