Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had another exciting and productive week in school. Year 6 really enjoyed their wow day immersing themselves in the history of our wonderful city. We enjoyed welcoming nursery parents to meet staff and explore our amazing indoor and outdoor nursery environments. These meetings took place after school and were safely managed by strictly limiting numbers and contact with staff and members of the public. I am delighted to inform you that our Covid cases have fallen significantly this week. Let us all hope that this situation continues to improve by everyone remaining very vigilant in following school and national guidelines to keep everyone safe.

We have had a lot of requests from prospective reception parents who would like to look around school whilst making a choice of school for their child in September 2022. We have risk assessed this, and we will be holding an open day on Thursday 21st October between 9.15 and 11.30 and 1.15 to 3pm. Attendance will strictly be by appointment only and will be limited to numbers of parents who can attend. We will be holding autumn parents' evenings for parents from Year 1 to Year 6 on Tuesday 19th and Wednesday 20th October between 4-6.30pm Reception parents can make appointments for meetings on Monday 18th October and Tuesday 19th October during the same hours. We were hoping to return to face to face parents' meetings, however we are following Local Authority advice and mitigations as part of our risk assessment and we will unfortunately have to hold these meetings remotely. This is due to the volume of parents who need to attend in a tight timeframe. Appointments to meet class teachers can be made online in the usual way.

AIP our school caterers, have recently worked in Manor Park to create a new promotional video for their service. They were overwhelmed with the children on this day. Learning in Year 1

The children have impressed me so much with their fantastic attitudes and it has been lovely to go in to classes to see the wonderful learning they have been doing. Year 6 have been on their WW2 trip to learn all about the impact that 'The Blitz' had on Coventry and also visited the Coventry Transport Museum to learn about evacuation. The Year 4 children have been busy working hard on their times tables this week and we have seen so much progress in their scores since the beginning of term - thank you parents for your support with this. In Year 5, the children have been learning about the very important pharaohs of Ancient Egypt. The work in their books is stunning and we are looking forward to sharing these with you as soon as we can.

Learning in Year 4

Year 4 had their first ukulele lesson this week! They had an introduction to chords and really enjoyed having a go at playing along to a song.

Learning in Year 5

This week, Year 5 have been learning about ancient Egyptian hieroglyphics, which was how ancient Egyptians wrote and read. There are some letters that have two different hieroglyphics. Only a small select group of people were allowed to have the knowledge to read and write in ancient Egyptian times, they were called 'scribes'. Scribes were the protectors and developers of ancient Egyptian culture, writing new texts and editing older ones. They were central to academic research, and they copied existing texts to preserve them for future generations. Year 5 learnt how to write their name in hieroglyphics and wrote a sentence explaining something they've learnt this half-term in hieroglyphics.

Learning in Year 6

This week, Year 6 had a wonderful trip to the Cathedral and the Transport museum. They spent the day exploring how Coventry became known as the city of reconciliation and discussed the impact on the city after it was devastated by the Blitz. Our guides were very impressed by Year 6's learning so far and commented on the brilliant guestions that were asked throughout the day.
