Learning in Nursery

The children in Wrens and Robins have been extremely busy in our wonderful creative area.

They have been experimenting with lots of different materials to make their wonderful creations. Well done everybody!

Nursery have enjoyed exploring the wider school setting this week. The children have visited the reception outdoor area and the KS1 adventure playground as we begin transition work. We have learnt about how to stay safe in the sun; by drinking water, finding shade and choosing to play inside sometimes. We have also learnt to read and write the letter 'k' this week and have been naming and describing 2d shapes.

This week we have had lots of fun making our own sock puppets for our own punch and Judy show. We used lots of mixed media such as wool, googley eyes, buttons etc, to make them as creative as possible. We then acted out our own puppet show with our friends.











Lower Phase: Years 1, 2 & 3

It has been a brilliant week in the Lower Phase! Year 2 have been reflecting on their fantastic trip to Warwick Castle and have been using their experiences to write excellent recounts in English. I have been so impressed with the effort they have put into these; the children should be really proud of themselves! In Year 1, the children have also been working hard with their writing. They have used drama to retell the story 'Lost in the Toy Museum' and have interviewed the main character Bunting. They have gone on to write some amazing diary entries from Bunting's perspective – well done Year 1! The children in Year 3 have been learning all about tools and weapons from across the prehistoric ages. They have been able to talk about the differences between the ages confidently and used this new knowledge to make their own prehistoric tools and weapons out of recycled materials. They have also taken part in a class debate about which prehistoric age was the best and why. It was lovely to see so many parents in Year 3 after school on Thursday; the children were so excited to share their learning with you. I look forward to seeing lots of Year 1 parents on Thursday 23rd and Year 2 parents on Thursday 30th (from 3.30-4pm in classrooms).

Learning in Year 1

Year 6 had a fantastic time on their residential in Wales - climbing mountains, kayaking, orienteering and even a day at the beach were just some of the activities they have enjoyed. Their residential experience in Plas DolyMoch is always incredibly popular and it is so lovely to see how much they gain in confidence and independence upon their return. During creative curriculum lessons this week, Year 5 have been researching famous astronauts. They learnt all about the achievements of Katherine Johnson and why she was such an influential figure in the history of space travel. Year 4 have had a very 'arty' week this week, designing and creating their own totem poles. They found out about the motifs used on totem poles and then created their own 3D versions.

Year 4 and 5 look forward to sharing their learning with you all next week during the parent 'Come and Share' event.
