Dear Parents and Carers.

I hope everyone is keeping well and enjoying the spring days and light warm evenings that are always a bonus at this time of the year. Children are now beginning to eat their lunch outdoors and we are introducing a range of summer activities at lunchtimes for children to enjoy.

Year 3 enjoyed their visit to Bishops Wood on Monday and Year 1 could not contain their excitement as they went on their visit to Saint John's Museum on Thursday. Both visits are planned as an integral part of the curriculum, and I would like to thank parents for their financial and practical support which ensured they could go ahead.

We are very mindful of the increased financial pressures everyone is facing, and we are carefully planning those activities which we must ask parents to contribute towards. In some instances, we are planning alternative experiences in our grounds or closer to school to reduce transport costs and the school will offset costs on visits wherever we are able to do so. Thank you for your continued support, which we really appreciate.

This week was an opportunity for our Year 2 children to shine, as they completed their Key Stage 1 SATS. The children were brilliant, displaying an outstanding attitude and great resilience. I hope you all know how proud we are of you, particularly after missing so much learning in school during the Pandemic. You are superstars!

Next week we are looking forward to welcoming Coventry Wasps on Thursday to speak to our winning house as we announce this half term house point winners in assembly on Monday. There are a few days left for children to SOAR to success and impress the staff to gain some more house points before the tokens are counted. We are very grateful to Coventry Wasps for supporting the school in this way.

Parents are invited to a remote Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) information session on Thursday 26th May at 6pm. This is an opportunity for parents to find out about the content of this sensitive topic which must be taught in primary schools. The session will give details of the content which will be taught in each year group and there will be the opportunity for parents to ask any questions.

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EYFS Phase: Nursery & Reception

They attended a lesson in a Victorian classroom and saw what it was like to go to school during this time. They had the chance to dress up and learnt about the difference between clothing and houses of the rich and poor. They also played with a variety of Victorian toys and reflected on how different they were to the toys they play with today. Year 2 have made us all so proud with their hard work and positive attitudes towards their SATs this week. They are really looking forward to their end of SATs party next week and their trip to Warwick Castle after the half term break. Well done Year 2!

The Upper Phase children have continued to show fantastic resilience, positivity and originality this week. The children in Year 4 have been practising their multiplication skills and the progress they have made since the beginning of term has been phenomenal. They have also been learning about different mountain formations during their geography lessons and even had a go at making their own! Year 5 have been using their descriptive writing skills to create a character and setting description based on 'The Agents of Shield'. It was lovely to see their creativity and imagination being used to great effect within these pieces of writing. Year 6 have also had a busy week this week! They have finished their African inspired masks, used our school green screens to practise their computing skills and started to read Macbeth as inspiration for their next writing unit.
