Learning in Nursery

This week in Nursery the children have been learning how to make marks to represent quantities using Numicon to help.

Learning in Year 3

Learning in Year 4

In our science lesson this week, we learned about how chemical reactions occur and produce gases. We mixed different amounts of bicarbonate of soda with vinegar and then watched the gas inflate the balloons.

Learning in Year 5

Year 5 really enjoyed researching about different gods and goddesses from ancient Egypt this week. They created informative fact files about their favourite god or goddess and compared and contrasted them using a Venn diagram. The children also showed their creativity by creating their own god or goddess, explaining what they would be worshipped for and how they would have benefitted the people of ancient Egypt.



This week Year 6 visited Coventry Cathedral to find out more about how it became a symbol of reconciliation following WW2. Year 6 showed excellent knowledge about the subject and asked thoughtful questions. We are very proud of them!
