
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Learning in Nursery

We spent the morning engaging in different Egyptian activities like decoding hieroglyphics, measuring in Egyptian mathematical units, and improving our knowledge on this fascinating period of history. Throughout the afternoon we observed the mummification process, took part in a Pharaoh's burial parade, and enjoyed being animals as we hunted along the river Nile. Everyone looked fantastic in their Egyptian costumes and were incredibly creative with their choices.
