## Lower Phase: Years 1, 2 & 3

The children in Year 1 spent a lovely afternoon in the Memorial Park as part of their science learning on seasons. They produced observational drawings and identified different birds and plants throughout the park. Year 2 have been observing the cress seeds which they planted last week and found that some of their predictions were correct.

Interestingly, they found that the cress seeds in the dark have grown but they are yellow! They planted their own bean seed and will be keeping an observational diary over the coming weeks. It would be wonderful if they could do some planting and growing at home too! The children in Year 3 are getting very excited about their trip to Cadbury World next week! During D&T day on Tuesday, the children designed and made their own chocolate bar prototype thinking carefully about their target audience. They made the chocolate to go inside the packaging and even created an advert to encourage others to buy their product.

### Learning in Year 1

This week Year 1 took a walk to the Memorial Park to observe seasonal changes. The weather was certainly much kinder to us than on our autumn walk! The children made observational sketches of different trees and plants and they also tried to spot different types of bird. Well done Year 1; it was a real pleasure to take you out for the afternoon.

#### Learning in Year 2

This week in Year 2 we have been learning how to give change. We turned our classrooms into the Manor Park shop and took it turns to be the shopkeeper and the customer. We used our previous knowledge of the number line to subtract one number from another.

## Learning in Year 3

On Tuesday, Year 3 had their D&T day! They created a new chocolate bar, designed packaging for it and then made the chocolate bar itself!

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## Upper Phase: Years 4, 5 & 6

I have really enjoyed spending some time in the Upper Phase classrooms this week talking to the children about their love of reading. They were all so enthusiastic about the books available to them and were keen to share some of their favourite reads with me. Over the next few weeks, we will be introducing a book with recommended reads in all classrooms. The children can access these to discover what they might like to read next based on their friend's recommendations. We look forward to sharing these with you. The Year 6 children have been using the reading caravans this week to research all about climate change. They used a range of non-fiction books to make notes and find out about the inspirational 'Greta Thunberg'. Year 5 have been our super scientists this week! They have been learning how to separate solids and liquids and used the filtering technique to check whether solids were soluble or insoluble. This week Year 4 have been learning about the history of sea exploration; focusing on the famous explorer Jacques Cousteau.

Year 4 have had fun learning all about vertebrates and invertebrates this week. They created their own guess who cards!


#### Learning in Year 5

This week Year 5 have been applying their learning from last week on water resistance. They tested their designs to understand how the shape of an object affects the amount of water resistance. Year 5 confidently used timers in their experiment and repeat testing to see an average time it took each shape to sink to the bottom of the beaker.

#### Learning in Year 6

This week, Year 6 have been learning about climate change. We have looked what causes global warming and analysed what can be done to help slow down climate change. We then produced documentaries about how climate change is effecting the polar regions.
