A message from our Headteacher: Jill O'Connor

Dear Parents and Carers.

I hope you are keeping safe and well.

Like so many other schools, we have had our highest ever number of children and staff testing positive with Covid this week. Thankfully, all infected children and staff have reported mild symptoms, however it is causing immense pressure on staffing and school organisation. As a result of this we are having to make some ongoing temporary changes to staffing to ensure that all children remain in school and are taught by a teacher in their own class. The health and well-being of children and staff remains our highest priority, along with delivering the best teaching and learning experience that we possibly can for children in school and those isolating during these unprecedented times.

With the Omicron variant circulating transmission, may I ask that you all continue to play your part in keeping everyone safe. Please do not send your child into school if they have any Covid symptoms or are ill in anyway. The most common symptoms of COVID-19 are recent onset of:

- · new continuous cough and/or
- · high temperature and/or
- · a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

When COVID-19 is circulating, it is worth also being aware of the wider symptoms of COVID-19 including:

sore throat, headache, muscle ache, fatigue, shortness of breath, blocked/runny nose, diarrhoea, vomiting, and cold like symptoms.

I appreciate that lateral flow testing devices are currently in short supply, but would request that children are tested twice weekly as a minimum wherever possible. Any positive cases should be reported immediately on the school Covid e mail and learning mentors will contact you regarding the next steps to be taken, following your child's immediate isolation.

Please note that there is a change to government guidance for those with Covid ending isolation after 5 full days following two negative tests to take effect from Monday 17th January. Timings of the School Day

May I remind you that children in Years Reception to 6 must be in class no later than 8.55 am. The gates open at 8.40 am to allow for a 15-minute window for arrival in school. Gates will be closed at 8.55 am. If your child arrives after their respective start time then they should report to the school office to be signed in as late as registration will have closed. Persistent lateness is regularly monitored and discussed with the school's attendance officer. Thank you for ensuring a smooth and prompt start to your child's learning day and for avoiding unnecessary interruption to the start of the day for all other children in their class.

We are delighted to once again offer a wide range of extra-curricular clubs which are running every day after school this term. Please register your child for a place if they would like to join in the fun.

We will continue to need confirmation of these negative tests through the NHS app before we can re admit children and staff back into school following this reduced isolation period.

The children in Wrens and Robins have had an amazing time playing in our wonderful outdoor area. They have had fun making lots of sand castles and tracks for the cars.


This week in Kingfishers nursery we have been having lots of fun making a train with the junk modelling and talking about different types of transport.


Everyone had a great day out and learnt lots of interesting facts.


Learning in Year 6


