It's good for us all to be aware of this character, in case children mention it.

It is certainly not a nice cuddly bear, as its name suggests.

This is a game/character that children are being exposed to on platforms such as Tiktok and YouTube.

The character is named 'Huggy Wuggy' from the 2021 horror game 'Poppy's Playtime'.

The character sounds like a cuddly bear, but is actually encouraging children to copy behaviours -

hugging people randomly, but then carrying out violence and verbal abuse.

There are also some images in the game and within videos of this character which can be disturbing.
