A message from our Headteacher: Jill O'Connor

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have really enjoyed welcoming parents of our new nursery children into school this week as part of their child's induction process. All parents of our existing or new nursery children are welcome to visit our nursery with their child on transfer day next Wednesday July 6th, to meet the nursery team and spend time in our new nursery classrooms. These visits will be during allocated sessions. Timings of sessions have been sent to all nursery parents. We look forward to seeing you on this day. Please do call in and visit if you are able to do so.

Our children are all very excited as they have been told their new class and teacher for September today. Letters with your child's new class and teacher have been sent out to you today. As we are a three-form entry school, we are fortunate to have the flexibility to regroup classes within year groups if we feel it will be beneficial to the children. Our school policy is that we only split classes where we feel this will be advantageous to the children in a particular year group. We spend a considerable amount of time and care in ensuring that where we split classes, children are carefully placed with friendship groups. Whilst I do not envisage any problems at all, please do e mail or call me immediately if you have any issues and would like to do so when you receive your child's new class, as the happiness of children and parents is our main priority at this important time of the year.

All children will spend a full day in their new classes on Wednesday July 6th. Please drop off and collect children from their own classrooms where they will be registered and dismissed at the beginning and end of the day before moving to their new classes. Almost all our new staff will be in on the day to meet their new classes. The learning mentor team are always on hand to support any vulnerable children who would benefit from some extra reassurance between now and the end of the year as they move to their new classes. Do not hesitate to contact them if you would like to do so or if you have any concerns.

We are very sorry that we will be saying goodbye to two of our teachers, Chris Kirby who is moving to a school in Warwick, and Vanessa Bourke, who is leaving to take up an alternative position outside of teaching. Mrs Moore will be staying with us for part of the autumn term before starting her maternity leave but will not be class based. Some of our support staff are also leaving us to begin exciting new pursuits. Two of our learning support assistants Emily Fellows and Emma Cook are leaving to begin initial teacher training, as working at Manor Park has convinced them that a career in teaching is an amazing profession. Rizwana Sayed and Joshua Wishart are leaving to take up positions after completing their apprenticeships with us. Our thanks and very best wishes are extended to all these staff for everything that they have done for Manor Park.
