A message from our Headteacher: Jill O'Connor

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope this newsletter finds you safe and well. We have had another wonderful week in school. Children are really enjoying the launch of their new topics and their WOW events in school, as well as visits and trips out of school, which have all been fantastic. Our Year 1 children experienced their first ever school trip and they could not contain their excitement in participating in this memorable event!

Covid cases of children and staff remain high, and this continues to place considerable pressure on staffing and school organisation. Staff are all being very flexible and are working incredibly hard to ensure teaching and learning remains as strong as possible and classes are disrupted as little as possible. It will come as no surprise to you that the children remain outstanding in their behaviour and attitude towards their learning in the middle of all this turmoil. They are a credit to you all and we continue to feel proud of them every day.

We were delighted to hear that the government will shortly be relaxing rules, and we will hopefully be able to return to more normal school routines before not too long. We still have numbers of positive cases sufficiently high enough that we will not be able to relax the wearing of masks for staff in public areas from next Thursday. The triggers for reaching these thresholds currently remain as 5 positive cases of children and staff in any particular year group, 10 cases across the school or five or more staff which impacts on staffing capacity. We are anticipating that the national guidelines will change again, and we will update you accordingly. It is reassuring that there does finally feel to be an end in sight!

We are looking forward to our spring parent's meetings which will take place on February 15th and 16th between 4-6.30pm. We had been hoping to revert to face to face appointments which is our long-term aim, however due to high Covid cases we will once again have to offer these meetings as remote appointments. Details for booking an appointment to meet your child's teacher are attached. Please book in a time that is suitable for you to enable you to meet the staff and share in your child's wonderful achievements.

We are excited that we are extending our lunchtime offer, and from next week children in Key Stage 2 will have the opportunity to join a languages or art club which will both be on offer each lunchtime from Monday next week. We are also very pleased to inform you that we will be re-launching Manor Park University from next Friday, which remains a firm favourite with the children across school.

Learning in Year 4



Learning in Year 5


