Learning in Nursery

This week in Nursery, we have been speaking about special celebrations and we have been celebrating Eid. We talked about what Eid is and made Eid cards for our friends and family.

Learning in Reception

This week in Reception, we've had new additions to our classroom. We are so excited to watch them grow and to see what happens.

Learning in Year 1

This week Year 1 have been exploring 2D shapes. We went on a 2D shape hunt around school and had a go at sorting 2D shapes into different categories.









Learning in Year 2

This week in Year 2, the children have continued their learning about castles in the 'Conquering Land and Sea' topic. We have looked in more detail at Kenilworth Castle and Warwick Castle and compared the two. As scientists, we have investigated how we can make changes to various materials by squashing, twisting, bending or stretching them.

Learning in Year 3

This week we have been using maps to locate the counties of the UK and then looking at landmarks in some of these counties from the Stone Age.

Learning in Year 4

This week in Year 4, the children have continued with their 'Invaders' topic. We played the memory game to learn about why the Vikings invaded Britain and the impact that the invasion had.

Learning in Year 5

This week in our geography lessons, we have been learning all about South America. We used Digimaps to locate the countries of South America and we used Adobe Spark to create a fact file about the physical features that are found there, such as the Amazon River, the Amazon Rainforest and the Atacama Desert. We have loved our new topic so far! Have a look at our fantastic work on SeeSaw.

Learning in Year 6

Year 6 have been learning about the circulatory system in science, We spent some time learning about the role that the heart has to play within the system, and using our new found knowledge we then drew and labelled diagrams of the heart.



Manor Park University


During Manor Park University the children in the 'Read all about it!' course have been creating articles for their school newspaper project.


Bike Donations

Online Safety

From Gooseberry Planet

It's important youngsters are reminded of the dangers of some TikTok trends. Sadly, a 13-year-old boy has died in the US in the "Benadryl challenge", which youngsters do to induce hallucinations.

In other news, the Online Safety Bill – landmark legislation that aims to rewrite the rules for policing the internet – heads into the final stages next month. But the

controversy rumbles on, and WhatsApp, Signal and other encrypted messaging services have signed an open letter opposing it. It's proving tricky finalising the law to balance taking action on harmful content and protecting privacy. And finally, we look at the disturbing finding that "zombie knives" are being sold to children as young as 13 through social media apps like TikTok and Snapchat.
