A message from our Headteacher: Jill O'Connor

Dear Parents and Carers.

Welcome back to everyone, after what I hope was a wonderful Easter break spent with families and friends.

It has been fantastic to catch up on all the children's holiday news and hear about their many adventures.

Reception set the scene for the excitement of the summer term ahead, when they returned to school on Monday dressed as minibeasts for their minibeast WOW Day. Do check their Twitter feed to get a flavour of their day. I am sure you will all agree that they were the 'bees knees'!

The Islamic festival of Eid ul Fitr has been celebrated yesterday and today, with many of our children and staff joining in the festivities. A very happy Eid to all our families. All children will be participating in Eid activities on Monday 24th April in recognition of this important festival.

We are getting particularly excited about the King's Coronation which we will be celebrating in school on Friday 5th May. Children will be coming off timetable all morning on this day to join in a range of activities linked to this prestigious historical occasion. Children and staff are invited to dress in red, white and blue and all can join in our Coronation whole school picnic on the fields at lunchtime on this day.

We are organising a themed picnic which all children who usually have a free or paid school lunch will automatically receive on this day (no pre booking required). 

Learning in Nursery

During Manor Park University the children in the Sports Leadership course have been creating and planning their own PE lessons.






