Learning in Nursery

This week in Nursery, we have loved learning all about superheroes. We have talked about what superheroes need, completed a superhero training camp and made our own superhero masks and capes!

Learning in Reception

This week in Reception we have been using our imagination and our knowledge of the different types of transport we have learnt about so far. We then designed and made our own imaginary vehicle.

Learning in Year 1

Learning in Year 2

This week Year 2 have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes. Here we are exploring the edges, vertices and faces of 3D shapes!

Learning in Year 3

In DT today, the children are designing their own chocolate packages for their chocolate bars. They've had to think about what makes a chocolate bar eye-catching and included: colours, fonts, packaging shapes and name of their chocolate.

Learning in Year 4

This week we were looking at changes to an environment that can pose a danger to living things. We looked at both natural and manmade changes and thought about what we could do to help improve the situations for living things. Our ideas included creating habitats for animals, putting food out for hedgehogs, recycling and trying to buy products that don't use palm oil.

Learning in Year 5

This week Year 5 carried out a scientific investigation: 'Do heavy objects fall at a greater speed if the objects are the same size and shape?' The children wrote predictions and tested their hypotheses outside using film canisters. They kept one canister empty and filled the other with sand. The children used a range of scientific vocabulary to write their conclusions.

Learning in Year 6

Year 6 have been learning all about an Inuit artist called Kenojuak Ashevak. We have studied some of her artwork and created our own pieces ensuring we added movement. We then used mixed media to add colour and tone.



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
Manor Park University
