

Learning in Nursery

This week we have started learning all about pets. We talked about what a pet is and where they live and had a go at drawing different pets and then we spoke about our drawings.

Learning in Year 3

Learning in Year 4

This week in Year 4 we have begun our learning on decimals. We started by looking at tenths and hundredths. We used dienes to represent them and practically support our learning.



This week Year 5 used different charcoal and chalk skills to recreate their impression of 'Starry Night' By Vincent van Gogh. The children used different chalks and charcoal to blend, side stroke, cross hatch and feather.



Learning in Year 6



During Manor Park University the children in the gardening course have been foraging for materials and creating signs for the school's outdoor areas.








