
Learning in Year 3

This week as part of our science learning, Year 4 grouped sea creatures in a variety of ways.




Year 5 learned about Earth's time zones this week. The children worked in groups to find out what time it is in many destinations across the world when it's 2pm in the UK.

This week during Manor Park University the children in the 'Read all about it!' course have been planning what they would like to include in the school newspaper.








Attendance
