This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas:

- **curriculum music**
- **extra-curricular provision**
- **musical experiences**

The summary also includes changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.



## Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

- **EYFS** – music is interwoven into whole day routine through songs for tidying up, activities, nursery rhymes, stories, soundscapes
- **Year 1 - 3** – Following the Charanga original scheme which focuses on listening, finding the pulse, singing, following basic scores and graphics/images, using tuned (glockenspiels) and untuned (djembes, varied percussion) classroom instruments (1 hour per fortnight)
- **Year 4** – Following the Charanga scheme for warm-ups, games, listening activities and songs. (1 hour per fortnight)
- **Year 4** – Additional input from specialist music tutor from Coventry Music using voice and ukelele through whole class instrument teaching, covering all the interrelated dimensions of music. (2 hours per week for 1 term)
- **Year 5 - 6** – Following the Charanga scheme for warm-ups, games, listening activities and songs with additional use of music technologies, covering all the interrelated dimensions of music. (1 hour per fortnight)
- **Year 1 – 6 Music Celebration Afternoons** – Building on the knowledge gained through fortnightly music lessons, children engage in a topic-specific composition session (with both music technology and tuned/untuned instruments) around a hook or theme. These are an opportunity to consider the audience, explore music components, compose, perform and evaluate the work.

## Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

- KS2 Manor Park Choir - Lunchtime
- Stagecoach Theatre – singing/acting/performing – Manor Park University
- Guitar, keyboard and drum individual music lessons with Coventry Music tutors (subsidised for Pupil Premium children)
- Guitar ensemble music lessons with Coventry Music tutor (subsidised for Pupil Premium children)
- Children In Care – offered free lessons via Coventry Music
- End of Year 6 show



- EYFS Nativity performances
- Regular singing assemblies
- Class assemblies Year 1 – 6 - singing
- Manor Park Music Showcases – Christmas and End of Year
- Utilise Coventry Music's free instrument hire for those accessing provision
- Signposting pupils to music activities outside the school day including those in partnership with Coventry Music.

## Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

### Musical Events:

- Taking part in Coventry Music multi-school singing events for KS1 and KS2 – free
- Manor Park Choir attending and taking part in Young Voices performance at Resorts World Arena
- Attend live music concerts by Coventry Music
- Live performances from the Coventry Music tutors – paid for by school
- Opportunity for singing at local community events/venues – Manor Park Choir
- Termly Manor Park University Showcases – for siblings of performers

## In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

- Extending our curriculum provision to 1 hour per week from fortnightly
- Exploring additional instruments for whole class instrument teaching
- Increasing numbers of individual music lessons and adding additional instruments like woodwind, strings and brass
- Look at additional options to give progression opportunities from whole class ie: ukulele to guitar or ukelele ensemble follow up
- Exploring additional instrumental ensemble opportunities
