#### 1. Introduction: what a publication scheme is and why it has been developed

One of the aims of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (which is referred to as FOIA in the rest of this document) is that public authorities, including all maintained schools, should be clear and proactive about the information they will make public.

To do this we must produce a publication scheme, setting out:

- The classes of information which we publish or intend to publish;
- The manner in which the information will be published; and
- Whether the information is available free of charge or on payment.

The scheme covers information already published and information which is to be published in the future. All information in our publication scheme is **[either available for you on our website to download and print off or]** available in paper form.

Some information which we hold may not be made public, for example personal information.

This publication scheme conforms to the model scheme for schools approved by the Information Commissioner.

#### 2. Aims and Objectives

The school aims to:

- enable every child to fulfil their learning potential, with education that meets the needs of each child,
- help every child develop the skills, knowledge and personal qualities needed for life and work, and this publication scheme is a means of showing how we are pursuing these aims.

#### 3. Categories of information published

The publication scheme guides you to information which we currently publish (or have recently published) or which we will publish in the future. This is split into categories of information known as 'classes'. These are contained in section 6 of this scheme.

The classes of information that we undertake to make available are organised into four broad topic areas:

*School Prospectus* – information published in the school prospectus.

Governors' Documents – information published in the Governors Annual Report and in other governing body documents.

*Pupils & Curriculum* – information about policies that relate to pupils and the school curriculum.

School Policies and other information related to the school - information about policies that relate to the school in general.

Safeguarding	In the interest of safeguarding children there may be occasions when the school has to consult other agencies without a parent's prior knowledge. The schools first concern is the child's welfare and the school has a duty to act to protect the child at all times. Such consultation may result in a formal referral which could prompt visits from social services and/or the police.  Working alongside the school's existing safeguarding processes we use CPOMS which is a system which enables us to manage child protection, behavioural issues, bullying, special educational needs, domestic issues and much more. It is a system which ensures that students are safe and fully supported and all staff are trained and have an obligation to use CPOMS to report any concerns about the children in their care. Information from CPOMS can also be transferred to secondary schools who also use CPOMS. The transfer of information is done in a secure
	way and means that the safeguarding of a child is continued when they have left primary school.  All procedures laid down by the Coventry Safeguarding Board are followed by the school.
