Online learning has resumed for all children and it has been fantastic to see them all fully engaged with their teachers. Our online free school meal voucher system is up and running so these should be available for you instantly without having to come to school to collect them. Remember that we are all here to help and we can be contacted via e mail or by coming to the school office during normal opening hours. Do not hesitate to do this if we can assist you in any way.

We kept school open every day during the holiday for our vulnerable children and those of key workers, including the bank holidays. The children had a great time learning in school with the staff, participating in Easter activities and having fun with their friends. We are operating very good safe distancing measures in school and we are looking carefully at how we can do this if we are told we can take more children sometime soon. We are all desperate to be able to do this as soon as we possibly can. I can assure you that we are looking at government guidance daily and we will stringently follow this as we make decisions about school reopening to children. The safety of our children, parents and staff remain our highest priority.

During the closure, the LA has supported us once again in having a significant amount of roofing work completed, which is well underway. This is the final phase of roofing work which will prolong the life of our school building for many years to come. We are extremely grateful to the LA for supporting us in what is a huge and very expensive essential piece of maintenance for our wonderful school building.

We are continuing to develop the school during this essential school closure. Mr Connelly and his team have built a new bike store on the Key Stage 2 playground to enable Years 5 and 6 to cycle to school and safely store their bikes. They are busily building another one for Years 3 and 4. Other work has included building an outdoor bird look out in the forest school and refurbishing classrooms ready for the children when they return. Our cleaning team are working daily and doing a deep clean of the school.

I sincerely hope that you and your families are keeping safe and I wish you continued good health and happiness during this rare opportunity to spend so much time with your children and close families. I appreciate however that we all desperately want life to return to normality.
