
Next Week:

★ Ways to Support Your Child at Home ★

We are playing sound games with the children to support them in their early phonic skill development. Games such as 'I Spy With My Little Eye...' are great to help with initial sounds. We are also playing 'Robot Talk' where we break words up into syllables and talk like robots so that the children can begin to segment and blend sounds in words. We have fun using a range of different voices when we are sharing songs and stories with the children and they are becoming more confident when joining in. Games like these and enjoying listening to different sounds when you are out and about help the children to tune into sounds which is an excellent pre-reading skill.
