Our Reception Team would like to welcome back all of our families after our half term break. We have a very busy second half of the Autumn Term ahead and the children have all settled back into their school routines beautifully.

This half term we will be continuing to support the children to develop their early reading and writing skills through carefully planned activities including sharing stories, role play opportunities, creative writing and mark making. The children are enjoying their daily phonic activities where they are learning new sounds and reading and writing words. We are also supporting the children to read simple sentences. They are also enjoying exploring different writing styles including name writing, labels, captions, lists and simple sentences. In maths we will be continuing to extend the children's learning through lots of exciting counting, number, shape and measuring activities. We are encouraging the children to use their maths and English writing books to begin to record some of their work. We are teaching the children how to write their numbers and letters using the correct formation and ways to support your child to master these very important skills can be found at the start of their Home/School Learning Journals.

The children are very enthusiastic to explore their creative, physical, social and investigative skills in the classrooms and in the outdoor spaces in our school environment. We are also continuing to use the school hall for P.E. activities and the children will continue to change into their kits for this activity. Please make sure that they have a P.E. bag with dark shorts and a t-shirt inside and that all of their belongings are clearly labelled with their names. Our Creative Curriculum Topic for this half term is Mirror, Mirror! We will be supporting the children to explore light sources, night and day, space and reflections in our creative work and scientific investigations. We will be joining in with re-telling the story and writing about the magic mirror. The children will have fun investigating symmetry and reflections. They will continue to have regular opportunities to visit our wonderful forest school where they can extend their outdoor learning experiences.
