



Please select at least 4 homework tasks to complete over the autumn term. Your work will be presented in your creative curriculum books.











D&T

- Design and build your own pyramid using lego or recycled materials. You could include passages and tombs inside your pyramid just like the ancient Egyptians did.
- What did ancient Egyptians eat? How does this differ to what people in Egypt eat now? Choose an Egyptian recipe that is typically eaten today, buy the ingredients and have a go at making it.

Computing

- Make a stop-motion animation to showcase a particular area of your learning that has interested you.
- Use programming software to design an obstacle course for an Egyptian trying to reach the afterlife. Think carefully about the types of challenges they might face and who they might meet along the way.

Geography

Create a fact file about the geography of Egypt. Think about where it is




- situated in the world as well as human and physical features. You might decide to make a 3D model instead!
- Why was the River Nile so important in ancient Egyptian times? How did it help this ancient civilisation to survive? Present your research however you would like.

Research ancient Egyptian cartouches. What were they used for? Create your own cartouche and use hieroglyphics to depict your name. You could make a 3D cartouche using clay or draw and colour/paint.

Have a go at making your own papyrus or ancient scroll using tea bags or coffee. Once dry, draw and paint/colour an Egyptian design of your choice.
