HOMEWORK

There is a continued expectation that children will read regularly at home. Children will be able to take Accelerated Reader books from school and read them at home. Please try to listen to your child read at least once a week.

There will be a piece of homework set every Friday, which will be due in on the following Wednesday, which could be linked to any aspect of our learning. Due to the success of Seesaw during school closures, we will be setting homework on this platform from now on. If your child is unable to access Seesaw at home, we will provide a paper copy of the homework.
