CREATIVE CURRICULUM

Our creative curriculum enables children to become independent learners, to think for themselves and to transfer their learning skills into a range of situations. Our topic for the autumn term is 'Rising from the Rubble!'



During this topic, the children will learn all about the countries involved in WWII, evacuation and the impact that the war had on Coventry. We hope to take the children on a visit to Coventry Cathedral so that they can see the devastation caused during the night of The Blitz and also experience what it may have been like during an air raid.

ACCELERATED READER

As a school, we will now be using accelerated reader as our reading scheme. The children have previously used this in school so will be familiar with the programme. The children are expected to read on a daily basis and this will be checked on a Friday when looking at reading diaries. Children will be able to choose from a range of highguality and diverse texts and will then take guizzes on the books they have read to check their understanding.
